

June 8, 2010

Regular monthly town board meeting, as posted at Mike's Service, Bob's Northern Lights and Strong's and notice having been published in the Antigo Daily Journal, was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Chairman Casper Buettner. Also present were Supervisors Susan Hawley and William Majest, Linda Frank, treasurer and Mary Lee Heise, clerk. Townspeople present were Mike and Sharon Steckbauer and George Rock.

The Pledge of Allegiance was given by all present.

The agenda was approved upon motion by Supervisor Hawley and seconded by Supervisor Majest, motion carried.

Minutes of the May meeting was approved upon motion by Supervisor Majest and seconded by Supervisor Hawley, motion carried.

The treasurer's report was read by Linda Frank. The report was approved as read upon motion by Supervisor Hawley and seconded by Supervisor Majest, motion carried.

New Business:

Silver Birch property ó Silver Birch has called the town chairman concerning the property that they own near the town hall. The camp is interested in having the town take over this parcel of land. The board feels that the town is not interested in owning this land and discussed the interest expressed by another townspeople.

License renewals ó All liquor/beer licenses up for renewal were read to the board. Upon motion by Supervisor Hawley and seconded by Supervisor Majest all liquor/beer licenses were approved for renewal.

Bob Walters Property ó Due to the health issues of both Bob and Joni Walters there is nothing new to report in this matter.

Insurance renewals have been completed both over the phone and the internet.

Reminder given that Open Book is scheduled for June 11th from 10 a.m. to Noon and Board of Review is scheduled for the same day, but from Noon to 2 p.m. Discussion on current lake levels and property owned by the Schaller family.

General Building and Plant ó The door to the main hall needed to be replaced. The door frame also needed replacement. All work was done by Alex

Highway ó Mike Steckbauer and Alex Emerich have done road reconstruction on Killian Road in preparation of paving. Trees have been removed and the road widened. Mike Steckbauer was thanked for all of his hard work. Tony Letter from Northeast Asphalt will be measuring the roads that the town is considering paving this year both. He does this for the town, free of charge. Highway bids and TRIP program bids will be prepared in July.

Rescue Squad ó The next meeting is June 14th. George Rock stated that the rescue squad is doing a fine job for our community and should be commended.

Fire Department ó Raffle mailing is now done. The fire in June at the Connelly residence is now considered suspicious. Charges are pending.

Recycling Center ó The town got rid of the tires that were housed in the old semi-trailer at the dumpsite. The semi trailers as well as the old milk truck that was used for recyclables have now both been removed. Alex has cleaned up the area. B & B Containers brought out a small building for waste oil and some recyclables. The new building may need painting. George Rock asked if a fire extinguisher had been put up at the recycling center. The fire chief will be taking care of this matter.

Cemetery ó Bernard Deisinger is now going to put crops in field behind cemetery. He wants to be able to do this for at least 3 years. His equipment will fit thru the gate. Planting will keep noxious weeds out and level the field.

Correspondence reviewed. The clerk received an email concerning a meeting that she and the town chairman will attend concerning the possibility of a clinic in the Village of White Lake. The clerk presented information concerning the Clerk Conference to be held in August, and was given approval to attend. Withdrawal from Forest Crop papers were received concerning land owned by Kretz Lumber. The clerk will complete the paperwork and return it to the state. The clerk received a notice from the state concerning upcoming elections. The fall primary is September 14th and the fall election is November 2nd. The clerk discussed the bill received from Townsend concerning the plowing and sanding and sweeping of roads that they do for our township. The road they do this work on is that portion of Mary Lake road in our township. The bill is for 4 months.

Chairman Buettner asked that a letter be sent to the Sheriff thanking them for their quick solving of the break-ins in our township. George Rock suggested that a neighborhood watch sign be put up, especially down the Bank Road area. He believes a ñneighborhood watchö sign may be in order. Someone should check with the county to see if the city or other municipality has a ñwatchö program in place. The chairman stated that he would check with the county.

Bills submitted for payment were paid upon motion by Supervisor Majest and seconded by Supervisor Hawley, motion carried.

Motion to adjourn was made by Supervisor Hawley and seconded by Supervisor Majest, motion carried.
