- Project ChildSafe is a nationwide firearm safety education program developed by the National Shooting Sports Foundation that receives funding through a United States Department of Justice grant and the firearm industry.
- The Langlade County Sheriff's Office and City of Antigo Police Department has received safety kits through Project ChildSafe, which we will be distributing free of charge to local residents.
- We feel that if even one accident or death can be prevented through Project ChildSafe, the program will have been worth the effort.
- A key goal of the program is to prevent a loaded firearm from being left lying around the house where a child could pick it up and play with it. That's a tragedy waiting to happen.
- The firearm safety brochure that is provided with the gun lock is just as important as the lock itself. It explains the importance of safe handling and secure firearm storage in the home. We encourage everyone to read it and follow its advice.
