

**LANGLADE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
MONTHLY MEETING OF THE LANGLADE COUNTY BOARD – SEPTEMBER 25, 2023
COUNTY BOARD ROOM, LOWER LEVEL OF THE SAFETY BUILDING**

The Langlade County Board of Supervisors met in the County Board Room, Lower Level of the Safety Building. Chairman Pierce called the September 25, 2023 Monthly Meeting of the County Board to order at 5:32 p.m. On call of the roll, 19 Supervisors present, 2 absent. Absent: Supervisors Krueger and Zaverousky. Motion by Supervisor J. Wagner, second by Supervisor Bardo to excuse Supervisors Krueger and Zaverousky. All ayes, motion carried. The Board recited the Pledge of Allegiance and observed a moment of silence.

Citizens and Delegations, recognize other in Attendance: Chairman Pierce welcomed those in attendance for tonight's meeting.

Approve or amend the Agenda: Motion by Supervisor Benishek, second by Supervisor Balcerzak to approve the September 25, 2023 Agenda. Voice vote: all ayes, Agenda is approved.

Approve or amend the minutes of August 28, 2023 as printed: Motion by Supervisor Persen, second by Supervisor Poltrock to approve the minutes of August 28, 2023 as printed. Voice vote: all ayes, Minutes are approved.

Recognition of County Employees: Clerk Nagel read the September 2023 List: Milestones: Aaron Chrudimsky, Highway Shop Foreman, 10 years. Retirements/Resignations: Andrea Aderman, Corrections Officer, 6 years. New Hires: Brett Benes, Corrections Officer. The Board was also provided a copy of the Langlade County Staff Status Report, which lists by Department the staffing level, the current staff number, and the number of open positions in that Department. The Board will receive this list monthly.

Public Comment on Agenda Items and consideration of requests for Items to be added to future meeting agendas: Jolene Hartman, Dispatch Supervisor, addressed the Board regarding the staffing issues in Dispatch.

County Board Rule 14.1 Revised: Agriculture and Extension with Land Conservation and Solid Waste: 5 members for Ag & Extension. Land Conservation and Solid Waste: 6 members: 1 member from the Forestry Committee, 1 member from the WLUPC, 1 member from County Board and 3 other members whose vocation is agriculture. Corporation Counsel Stowe noted changes in the State Statute regarding membership on the Land Conservation Committee, changing an FSA Rep to a member whose vocation is Agriculture. Motion by Supervisor Medo, second by Supervisor Maier to approve the revised County Board Rule 14.1, changing the FSA representative to a member whose vocation is Agriculture. Voice Vote: 19 ayes, 2 absent, motion carried.

Old Business:

Review Langlade County Code of Ordinance, Chapter 7: Sheriff Westen addressed the Board with updates/changes to Chapter 7. Westen will provide the proposed changes to Chapter 7 to Corporation Counsel Stowe. Forest Administrator Murray addressed the Board regarding Chapter 7, comingling Traffic Laws and Routes/Trails. Murray will be working on a new Ordinance Chapter that will consist of Recreation Routes/Trails. Murray will forward the proposed Ordinance Chapter to Corporation Counsel Stowe. Discussion held. Proposed changes will be addressed at a public hearing.

New Business:

ADRC (Aging and Disability Resource Center of Central Wisconsin) Mike Rhea: ADRC Annual Report and Services provided by the ADRC to Langlade County: ADRC Director Mike Rhea addressed the Board, reviewing the ADRC 2022 Annual Report for Langlade, Lincoln, Marathon and Wood Counties. Rhea discussed the information and resources that prevent, delay and lessen the impacts of aging and disabilities in the lives of adults in our community, stating that the County Board Representatives to ADRC are Supervisor Bardo and Supervisor Benishek. Rhea stated that Langlade County has continued with the same tax levy since 2010, \$115,070. Discussion held.

County Board Position Statement on COVID-19 Mandates: Chairman Pierce stated RS #26-2023 did not make a Committee Agenda. Motion by Supervisor J. Wagner, second by Supervisor Persen to waive the Rules of the County Board, allowing the Board to act on RS #26-2023 tonight. Voice vote: All ayes, motion carried. The Board discussed

the template Resolution received from Marathon County, a copy was provided to each Board member. Discussion held on COVID-19 Mandates. The Board acted on RS #26-2023 at this time.

County Board Participation in On-Line Safety Training: Avoiding Sexual Harassment in the Workplace: H/R Generalist Chris Dulmes conducted the on-line training: Avoiding Sexual Harassment in the Workplace. The Board viewed the training and quiz was completed.

INTENT: REVISE THE RULES OF THE COUNTY BOARD REGARDING COMPENSATION FOR BOARD MEMBERS (PER DIEMS) EFFECTIVE APRIL 16, 2024

WHEREAS, Langlade County is a "self-organized" and therefore the compensation for Board members is established by the County Board (§59.10(1)(c), Wis. Stats.); and

WHEREAS, the current per diem structure was effective April 19, 2016; and

WHEREAS, the current rules of the County Board (in relevant part) provide for the payment of per diem as follows:

Rule 11.2 ... for attending meetings/trainings/conferences of committees of which he/she is a member. ... reimbursed for mileage expenses to and from all County meetings, and other meetings approved by the County Board Chairman or his/her designee, \$60 for Committee Chairperson, \$50 for Committee Member, with an additional \$20 for meetings over 4 hours; and

WHEREAS, the Committee recommends revising the per diem to take effect with the next Board term as follows:
\$75 for Committee Chairperson
\$60 for Committee Member, with an additional
\$20 for meetings over 4 hours; and

WHEREAS, the Committee recommends that the annual salary for the County Board Chairman established in Rule 11.1 shall be subject to the annual COLA granted to County employees.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Langlade County Board of Supervisors to establish a new per diem structure for the next County Board term beginning April 16, 2024. as follows:

\$75 for Committee Chairperson
\$60 for Committee Member, with an additional
\$20 for meetings over 4 hours;

and the annual salary for the County Board Chairman shall be subject to the annual COLA granted to County employees.

RESOLUTION #24-2023

INTRODUCED BY: ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE

INTENT: ALLOCATE FUNDING FROM GENERAL FUND FOR UNDER-REPORTED CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE WISCONSIN RETIREMENT SYSTEM

WHEREAS, upon conducting an internal audit of the financial system used to report annual gross earnings to the Wisconsin Retirement System (WRS), it was discovered that a financial template created during a previous administration resulted in under-reporting contributions to WRS; and

WHEREAS, whenever it is determined that WRS contributions were not paid in the year when due, the employer is required to collect the payments at the rates in effect at that time plus interest, and the employer may elect to pay part or all of the employee amounts [Sec. 40.06 (5), Wis. Stat.]; and

WHEREAS, the committee recommends transferring an amount, not to exceed \$41,000 from the General Fund, to fund the under-reported contributions to the WRS.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by a two-thirds (2/3rds) vote of the Langlade County Board of Supervisors to allocate not to exceed \$41,000 from the General Fund and remit the requisite amount (employer and employee share) to WRS for the under-reported contributions.

RESOLUTION #25-2023

INTRODUCED BY: ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE

INTENT: ALLOCATE \$170,000 FROM THE GENERAL FUND FOR THE “NEVA AREA” BROADBAND EXPANSION PROJECT

WHEREAS, large areas within Langlade County lack internet service or have internet service data upload and download speeds lower than those required for reliable data processing and data transmission; and

WHEREAS, by previous resolution the County Board pledged its support for the Langlade County Broadband Commission activities to make reliable high-speed Internet service, at federal minimum service standards, available to all areas of Langlade County, with priority given to projects based on areas that are unserved or underserved; and

WHEREAS, on August 15, 2023, the Langlade County Broadband Commission unanimously supported A PSC Broadband Expansion Grant application from Wittenberg Wireless LLC/Cirrinity to expand broadband to the “Neva Area” (see attached map), and recommended that the County Board pledge matching funds for this project; and

WHEREAS, the “Neva Area” Project consists of 15.87 miles of fiber optic cable with the potential to serve 9 businesses and 161 residents;

WHEREAS, reliable High-Speed Internet service and infrastructure related to Internet service are critical components in providing police, fire, rescue communication services and access to internet application which increase efficiency of these services and therefore improve public safety; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by a two-thirds (2/3rd) vote of the Langlade County Board of Supervisors to allocate \$170,000 to the "Neva Area" Broadband Expansion Project.

RESOLUTION #26-2023

INTRODUCED BY: COUNTY BOARD

INTENT: RESOLUTION IN OPPOSITION TO COVID-19 MANDATES

WHEREAS, the Langlade County Board of Supervisors supports the healthcare rights and freedoms of its residents; and

WHEREAS, during the COVID-19 pandemic, public health emergency orders issued statewide and nationwide included masking mandates applicable to businesses, schools, and public buildings; and

WHEREAS, the Langlade County Board of Supervisors is aware of studies that have shown that face masking may not have had a demonstrable effect on the transmission of airborne viruses such as COVID-19. Additionally, face coverings may impact the intake of carbon dioxide which may increase blood pressure, reduce cognitive ability, cause respiratory distress, and cause reproductive concerns; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin Statute Section 252.041 permits individuals, for reasons of religion or conscience, to refuse vaccination during a public health emergency; and

WHEREAS, the Langlade County Board of Supervisors finds that forced masking, vaccine, and isolation mandates may have caused harm to adults and children by contributing to isolation and increasing mental health crises and social anxieties. These mandates may also have affected verbal, motor, and overall development of children born during the pandemic; and

WHEREAS, as of August, 2023, masking mandates have been renewed in areas of the country where COVID19 transmission increases have been identified; and

WHEREAS, the Langlade County Board of Supervisors finds it is essential that the Board express its position that, unless required by law, Langlade County residents should not have their civil liberties jeopardized by mandates pertaining to face coverings or masking, vaccine requirements, or forced isolation, and should be free to make their own choices regarding whether to, and where to, utilize face coverings, vaccinate, or isolate.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Langlade County Board of Supervisors hereby expresses its position that, unless required by law, Langlade County residents should not have their civil liberties jeopardized by mandates pertaining to face coverings or masking, vaccine requirements, or forced isolation, and should be free to make their own choices regarding whether to, and where to, utilize face coverings, vaccinate, or isolate.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall be directed to the State of Wisconsin Department of Health Services and appropriate members of the Wisconsin Legislature
